Inner City Ministry

It was cold night with the winter chill just starting to bite. The team had been serving sandwiches and coffee, talking and ministering to those who came and now it was time to gather together and sing worship to God. This is something the team does regularly, the presence of the Holy Spirit is clearly with us as we sing praises. Some of our friends who come to the van clearly enjoy this time.

Several of our street friends joined us on this night. One was a man who had been drinking and was at times a bit angry and difficult. Nonetheless when the worship started he came straight over to join the circle and sing to God.

Some are a paradox, they get into the things they should not, but at the same time have a deep faith in God. You can see they have had a tough life which is often written on their faces -yet they know God and have experienced His forgiveness and love.

We sang several hymns and songs finishing with Amazing Grace- at that point this man yelled out that when you worship you need to lift your hands. It was a powerful reminder from our friend that worship is surrender to God.

There he stood arms lifted high in worship and surrender to God. It was touching and inspiring. It was worship from a man who deeply understood what the Lord Jesus had done, not only for humanity as a whole, but individually and personally for him.



We concluded with the Lord's Prayer, which he prayed with all his heart.

For me it was a vision seeing this man arms lifted high in worship and surrender to God, for what Jesus Cares is all about... an opportunity for our brothers and sisters on the streets to connect with God in a personal and powerful way.

That night the vision was fulfilled. I am sure our Heavenly Father was pleased to see his son worship the Father in Spirit and Truth.

I would also , like to thank all the volunteers who will faithfully serve this winter, may God richly provide for you all things and every blessing in Christ, as you sacrificially serve Him on cold nights in the city.

Lalor Park Shining through Darkness.

The last few months have been very difficult with 3 people we knew personally, losing their lives due to using drugs in our area. Mainly crystal meth (ice)

It has been difficult for the volunteers who have come to know and build personal relationships with people in our area and then to be faced with shocking loss of life with the very people they really care about. In the last 6 years we have become well known in our area and have built many relationships with lots of vulnerable people who live day by day.

We work hard to accept people whatever their background is and to love them as Christ would. Sometimes life doesn't turn out the way you expect or wish, but one thing I am sure about is that God does bring good out of the situation if we let Him.

KATE

One lady has been journeying with us for 6yrs (will call her Kate). Kate has known the people who have passed away and was very close to them even in sharing drugs and knowing others who were taking drugs. Kate has been through a lot herself including death in her family recently. Kate has come up to me and asked - why?

It is a good question. Why do people get caught up in such vile drugs? Attending funerals often tells the story of their life. Some of the reasons go back to their childhood; coming from dysfunctional families does not provide a strong basis to make the right choices in later life.

So after some time with Kate and expressing Christs love and the fact He hates what has been happening, Kate decided she wanted to help people in the community. By getting alongside some people she knew who were entrapped in drugs and encouraging them to come talk to me. It's about how to change knowing Gods way in life- so she has been going around encouraging people to get involved with the op-shop instead of just doing drugs at home.

One afternoon just recently Kate came to me in a mess totally broken and wounded saying she has had enough of people dying around her and she can't cope anymore.

My wife Louise talked with Kate and took her out to dinner with another Christian lady and they prayed for Kate. Through this prayer, Kate had a vision about Jesus standing before her putting His hand on her. They prayed some more and Kate gave her heart to Jesus in the restaurant. She was then asked if she wanted to come back to our home group which she did and shared her testimony with those there. Since then Kate is constantly in the op-shop helping out and looking out for others who are in difficulty. She is hungry to know more about Jesus so please pray for her and others we know to make the right choices- we know choosing Jesus is the best choice.

We are also running a budgeting course for the community to try help those who need help or just to make right choices with their finances to help them stay in control. We are doing it over 3 weeks each Monday from 10am-1pm once a term. So again keep us in your prayers as we reach out to this community, building relationships and supporting people through difficult periods,-sometime volunteers supporting volunteers.

Even in the darkest places and horrible situations God can shine brightly through His people. Help us to keep on shining especially for those like Kate.

Lakemba Book Table

Every Thursday we reach out into this Muslim and multicultural community

We give out Bibles, CDs and tracts in many languages and often people just take them and go on their way. There are those who want to engage in conversation. Some are looking for a debate, others show genuine interest.

We also offer coffee, something to eat and a sausage sandwich and this has opened up opportunities to pray for people.

One of our volunteers saw a man walking with great difficulty-using a stick with his arm in a sling. She started a conversation with him and he told her he had had surgery and was to have another operation. She told him that the Koran states that Jesus is a miracle worker and could she pray for him in Jesus name. He said yes and received the prayer. We don't know the outcome but he waved goodbye as he got into his car.


A young Indonesian man came and in conversation said that he was talking with Christians and wanted some Christian resources and so we gave him an Indonesian Bible and what we call the "Jesus book". Another young man from Indonesia engaged in conversation and also took an Indonesian Bible.

We were able to pray for a Greek lady who was overwhelmed by her caring responsibilities. She reached out grasped hold of one of our volunteers who prayed for her.

Young women in either full Islamic dress (niqab) or head covering (hijab) come to the table and ask for a Bible and other Christian material. Some either ask for a coloured plastic bag (so not be seen by others) to put the material in or just take it as it is.

Muslim men also come asking for a Bible in their own language. The most popular languages are Arabic, Bengali and Urdu in that order.

Many ask for a Bible rather than just a New Testament. There is much in the Koran about Abraham, Moses, Noah etc and they want to read what the Bible says. We have a book which we call the Jesus book that is based on the NIV but puts the life of Jesus into chronological order. Jesus is prophet of Islam and we simply say, you can find out more about Jesus if you read this book. Many take it.



JESUS CARES DINNER

On the 28th May, we held our 8th Annual Fundraising Dinner at Ryde Eastwood Leagues club. It is always an entertaining night and a time to meet up with some people we may not have seen in some time. 80 people attended the dinner this year .The speaker was Jorge Rodrigues from Samaritans purse who entertained us with a video of his work in Cambodia. \$35,000 was raised on the night. This is a huge blessing and enables the ministry to continue.

The costs of running Jesus Cares Ministry is well over \$100,000 a year This includes costs of running the van, food, rent for centre, cost of bibles and other resources for newsletter and salary for one coordinator and so the dinner is an important part of our fundraising.

We pray before we go out that we can be someone's miracle on the streets of Liverpool and we believe that Jesus Spirit in us provides comfort to those He sends us.

Mary (not her real name) said we were her miracle several weeks ago when we invited her to the table for a hot drink just after 6.00am. She gladly accepted a coffee and a biscuit saying she had been wondering the streets all night after being reluctant to return home to her 26 year old daughter who was a methamphetamine (ice) addict. Mary "poured out her heart" telling us that, while she believed in God, she saw herself as a poor example of a mother to her son and daughter after becoming an alcoholic when her marriage broke up and she had lost her job over ten years ago.



Our job at the table in Liverpool is not to make judgments but to comfort, as Jesus would, those who come to us and help them either to believe in (or progress in their faith) and know Jesus as their personal Saviour. We know from experience just how vulnerable people are to the vagaries of life, even church-goers, and admit that while we may not have all the answers, they can know the One who does if they seek Him. *David*
